Delia and Bernard, a middle aged married couple have finished their game of bridge with friends and are preparing for bed, when Delia has some sharp words with Bernard. He listens, and replies somewhat meekly as usual, but unknown to Delia the voice in his head is having a completely different conversation with her. This is his alter ego (Man), a character he has employed over the years to say the things to Delia he dared not say, and who has the ability to appear as a human being who can only be seen by Bernard.

As the evening progresses, Bernard is worried that his Man is developing a life of his own and tries to get rid of him. This does not work and causes a major row between himself and Delia when she misinterprets what is being said, assuming that Bernard is talking to her.

The situation worsens when a mysterious woman appears explaining that she is Delia's alter ego which delights Bernard to know that he is not alone in this strange situation. However more confusion develops when it becomes apparent that Delia still cannot see or hear Man and two other mysterious "friends" of Woman appear who can only be seen by her.

The plot development regarding the appearance of first Man then Woman and two other ghostly persona , creates a complex and fascinating comedy for the audience to grapple with, remembering that characters are visible to some but not all!!
